Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty

The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Pageant is held annually to select 3 young ladies (fulfilling the titles of Queen, Sr. Teen Queen, and Jr. Teen Queen) who have the desire and enthusiasm to serve as a representative for Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Committee and the city of Apache Junction, Arizona. The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty promotes Lost Dutchman Days Events throughout Arizona as well as locally. She is responsible for carrying the title proudly and fulfilling duties assigned by the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Committee to the best of her ability. Breaking any eligibility requirements, rules, agreements, and/or contracts will disqualify a contestant from the competition and cause her to forfeit any title as well as all awards at any time.

The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Committee is responsible for giving direction, support, and assistance to the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty during their reign. Also directs the ceremonies production and any other activities necessary to select a titleholder for the next year. The LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee has the authority to make provisions and waive eligibility, requirements and/or rules at any time.

Queen Scholarship Award

Each year the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo committee sponsors a scholarship for the woman who wins the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Queen position to become the 2011 LDD Queen will be awarded a \$1000 scholarship that can be renewed up to four years for a total of \$4000 at the school of her choice. This scholarship is only available to the winner of the LDD Queen 18-23 year old title, not for Sr. or Jr. category. Scholarship will be voided if winner must resign from her title for any reason. The scholarship can only be redeemed by contacting the LDD Chairman with a letter of acceptance from the school or with another form of conformation of school attendance. Scholarship money will be sent directly to the school and has no monetary value unless redeemed through a recognized school.

Titleholder/Contestant Requirements and Rules 2011

As a titleholder you are representing Apache Junction, you must be able to attend last minute functions and promotions. If the contestant does not follow these guidelines they will be disqualified to compete or hold a title for the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty.

Contestants must be a resident of Arizona as of January 1 of the year of competition.

The Lost Dutchman Days titleholders must remain living within Arizona during her reign. If you are studying at an institution outside of Arizona as of January 1 of the competition year you are **not eligible** to compete for a Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty title.

Each titleholder will be required to attend meetings, fundraisers, and other rodeo events that are **mandatory** during her reign as the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty. (see list at end of packet)

LDD Rodeo Royalty/Contestants are expected to conduct herself in a proper ladylike manner and portray high moral standards with a **kind and courteous manner**. Royalty will not be permitted to drink alcoholic beverages, smoke or use foul language at any time during the Lost Dutchman Days or when representing Lost Dutchman Days, and will be given a warning and can be sent home from an event or other disciplinary actions may be used.

LDD Rodeo Royalty/ Contestants must maintain at least a “C” average/ 2.0 GPA or higher (queen contestants may be exempt if not currently enrolled).

LDD Rodeo Royalty/ Contestants must not be married and never have been married or become married during her rein.

LDD Rodeo Royalty/ Contestants must not be pregnant, or have been pregnant or become pregnant while representing Lost Dutchman Days.

LDD Rodeo Royalty/Contestants must be prepared to provide horse(s), tack, and transportation necessary for all events and activities throughout the year promoting Lost Dutchman Days.

LDD Rodeo Royalty/Contestants must be prepared to provide her own wardrobe necessary for the Lost Dutchman Days events and any activities throughout the year promoting Lost Dutchman Days, according to the wardrobe guidelines

LDD Rodeo Royalty will be provided with parade drapes, crowns, banners, and belt buckles. The parade gear must be returned to the LDD rodeo royalty committee at the end of the Saturday LDD rodeo parade to be cleaned. And the perpetual crown presented at the Sunday crowning ceremony must be turned over in 2012 to the next LDD Queen. The Lady-in-Waiting Queen crown must be turned over immediately following the crowning

Cellular phones must be put on silent mode during all LDD Rodeo Royalty events, and must be **out of sight, no holsters**. During these events they are only to be used to contact a parent/guardian, fellow queens, LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee, or in the case of an emergency situation.

Cancellation Policy: In the event that a title holder must cancel out of an event that they have already agreed to appear at, such as a parade where entries must be sent in advance the title holder must cancel more than one week before the event. There are extenuating circumstances that can explain a “day of” cancellation, such as a vehicle breaks down on the way to an event, or severe allergic reaction to a bee sting. However if a title holder has more than two “day of” cancellations her position will be examined as to her ability to continue with her title.

If a member of current royalty competes in the pageant (for example, if the 2006 junior teen queen is now old enough to run for the 2007 senior teen queen position) she will in no way have seniority toward winning the new position.

The winner of the Queen category is responsible for updating the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty page on Myspace and the Rodeo Queen page on Facebook, that gives our fans updates on our activities and events and increases our accessibility.

Each member of the royalty is responsible for doing an article in the Bridle & Bit publication and Apache Junction Independent on a rotating schedule. (Queen turns in an article for March article by February 15th, Sr. Teen then turns in an article for April by March 15th and so on)

The Navajo County Fair and Rodeo in September is our sister rodeo, therefore it is the most important rodeo for the LDD Queens to attend apart from LDD's own activities. Disciplinary issues may result from missing this rodeo.

Reimbursement for travel expenses can only be provided from funds raised through royalty organized fundraisers (such as a queen clinic, or car wash) the raffles done at the rodeo benefit the royalty pageant account only not the individual queens.

Rodeo Royalty are expected to be good will ambassadors, this means they are in place to encourage investment into the LDD Rodeo. She needs to be comfortable talking to rodeo sponsors, thanking stock contractors, selling raffle tickets to spectators, and encouraging contestants to enter the rodeo. Due to the nature of rodeo these people are often male and for this reason having a visible boyfriend is discouraged at events, so that the royalty are more approachable and there are no jealousy issues

The Queen is responsible for being a leader and role model the two younger girls, therefore she needs to contact the younger girls before each appearance to ensure everyone has all the information needed to have an organized and enjoyable event. This may include passing on parking plans or knowledge gained from visiting the same event in the past.

Pageant Requirements and Rules

Awards will be given to the contestants scoring highest during all pageant activities in the following categories: Horsemanship, overall Appearance, On Stage, and Private Interview. The overall winners will be crowned Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty. Other awards include, but are not limited to Photogenic and Congeniality.

All applicants must complete the application process.

- **Queen** Contestants must not be less than 18 years of age or more than 23 years of age as of the first day of the competition (January 15 , 2011).
- **Senior Teen Queen** Contestants must not be less than 14 years of age or more than 17 years of age as of the first day of the competition(January 15 , 2011).
- **Junior Teen Queen** Contestants must not be less than 10 years of age or more than 13 years of age as of the first day of the competition (January 15 , 2011).

Each contestant is required to submit a **NON-REFUNDABLE \$50** entry fee with the enclosed application.

Contestants may not leave the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Pageant until after the award ceremonies at the end of the pageant. The pageant is not officially complete until contestants are checked out with the LDD Rodeo Royalty Coordinator. Until then they must abide by all pageant rules. Contestants not following these guidelines will jeopardize future eligibility, any runner-up status and/or awards.

In the event a contestant is a current titleholder of another rodeo, the current reign must be completed within 2 months* of the Lost Dutchman Days **pageant** and the **Lost Dutchman Days title must be the only title represented at the 2011 performances of the rodeo**. If the previous title is not completed within 2 months of the pageant and the LDD Rodeo Committee isn't notified of this fact, the Lost Dutchman Days title holder forfeits her new title as well as all awards.

* NOTE- If the previous title overlaps more than 2 months the LDD Committee Chairman will make the final decision as to a contestant's eligibility to compete in the LDD pageant by contacting both the Royalty Coordinator and the Rodeo Chairman of the contestant's previous rodeo. Eligibility status will be decided following disclosure of a candidate's intentions and with the blessing of the other rodeo's representatives whose reign she would be vacating to accept the LDD title. No duplicity will be granted.

The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Committee expects each contestant as well as supporters to display the highest degree of sportsmanship during the pageant, which **includes in the parking lot once the winners have been announced**. Each contestant should be mindful that they are representing the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo, pageant, and the sport of rodeo, the LDD Rodeo Committee, as well as the City of Apache Junction. Unsportsmanlike conduct could result in disqualification and affect future eligibility to compete in the LDD Rodeo Royalty Pageant.

Each contestant will compete on her own horse, and will sign an affidavit as to the personal or family ownership of the horse, and agreeing that is horse is the one that will be used at least 51% of all mounted LDD activities through out the year. If the horse does not belong to the contestant then the owner must sign off that the horse will be used by the contestant through out the year across Arizona. This makes the playing field more even so that one contestant doesn't borrow a champion reining horse for the pageant and then show up at the rodeo with the only horse they own, a green broke colt.

If a contestant's horse is visibly lame in the warm up pen the contestant will be asked to dismount, or if a contestant approaches the LDD coordinator with soundness concerns before horsemanship that day. She will be allowed to compete on another horse, preferably her own but a horse borrowed on an emergency basis is okay. A contestant will not be allowed to change horses in the middle of the horsemanship activities. Judges will ask about the lameness and may decide with the LDD Committee as to the contestant's horse eligibility for the year. Such as is it lame from an abscess or from severe laminitis, and does the contestant own more than one rodeo ready horse.

Note: A Lost Dutchman Days titleholder who violates any of the eligibility requirements/ rules during the competition or her reign will relinquish all rights, prizes, and privileges of her title at the request of the Committee.

Parents, Friends and Relatives

The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Pageant welcomes and encourages the presence of parents, friends, and relatives during the competition. The LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee requests complete cooperation from these supporters during pageant activities. At no time during the pageant shall parents, friends, or relatives disturb contestants or approach the judges. All spectators are expected to exhibit sportsmanlike conduct, and will not make derogatory comments about any contestants at risk of being removed from the contest grounds. During the pageant activities, the contestants will be required to be together as a group without coaching. **Some pageant activities are open only to Contestants, LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee members and Judges. If parents, friends, or relatives attend closed events, the contestant may be disqualified from the pageant at the LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee's discretion.** Parents, friends, and relatives are invited to attend all open activities and are responsible for obtaining tickets for the luncheon.

Problems and Complaints

Any problems and/or complaints should be immediately referred to the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Coordinators. The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Coordinator has full authority over the pageant and any decision they make regarding requirements, rules and/or participation is final. Displays of unsportsmanlike conduct in conjunction

with a complaint will not be tolerated.

Judging

The Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Committee takes judging our pageant very seriously and uses the following procedure for judging each contestant:

- ~ 3 Qualified Judges, such as past or present PRCA queens, and equine professionals will be selected to judge and each judge's score add together for each girl's final score.
- ~ In the event of a tie, in any category or any of the 3 titles, the decision will be made through the outcome of Miss Congeniality. However, no points will be added to or subtracted from contestant's scores.
- ~ Multiple people will be used to tally the judging sheets.
- ~ Score sheets will be handed or mailed to each contestant after the pageant.
- ~ A pageant judge may not be approached by anyone at any time before the final judging sheets are handed in. Action of this type can result in disqualification of the contestant at the discretion of the LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee. The LDD Rodeo Royalty Coordinator needs to be advised of any correspondence with a judge or if there is a conflict that needs to be resolved during or immediately after the pageant.

Pageant Activities

* Contestants must keep their numbers on at all times. A paper number will be given for horsemanship and a sticker /nametag type number for personal interview and onstage activities

Private Interview

This section will be private for judges, contestants, and LDD Rodeo Royalty Personnel ONLY! And will be held in a private/secure area.

The contestants may not discuss interview questions with other contestants until after the private interview section is complete.

Contestants will be judged on her knowledge of questions, how she executes her answers, as well as her poise and personality.

Interview questions may be related to rodeo (including terms, rules, standings, events) any current events, information submitted on your application, information on the study guide that is given to you in your second packet, and/or equine knowledge.

Each Jr. Teen contestant will be given 5 minutes to complete her interview and the Sr. Teen and Queen contestants 10 minutes to complete her interview.

Attire for private interview is in the Wardrobe Guideline section of the rules.

Horsemanship/Horsemanship interview

A biography card is required for this portion of the pageant. This description of the contestant is to be no more than one paragraph long to be read during each contestants ride.

* Contestant must keep their numbers on at all times, placement of number is up to the rider, either on back or on saddle pad.

Horsemanship skills including but not limited to: Control of mount, balance, ability and position of hands, feet and seat when riding, understanding of leads and proper execution of a specific pattern, proper mounting and dismounting, and knowledge of horsemanship and horse science.

Proper ring etiquette and showmanship, including how well a contestant projects her personality to the audience from horseback and the way each situation that may occur is handled.

Absolutely no animal mistreatment will be tolerated. Horses need water all day. If any abuse is reported to the LDD coordinator before or after the rides, at the trailer or in warm up the contestant will be approached and most likely disqualified.

Attire for horsemanship is in the Wardrobe Guideline section of the rules.

Mock Grand Entry with all contestants together will include following/keeping up with current royalty at a jog or lope while carrying flags around pivots in a serpentine pattern.

Presentation Runs will be done one at a time while their name and home town is read. Once finished all riders will line up together facing toward audience between the “pick-up men”. This will be much like what happens in the rodeo and will happen fast!

Presentation Run Patterns will be done with only one rider in the arena at a time. Activities like circling, stop/back, jogging, and weaving through cones will be added to a Presentation Run so the rider shows complete control over her horse. These skills may reduce runaway horses and crashes during a rodeo. The exact patterns will not be given until the day of pageant but a sample pattern will be included with second packet.

Horsemanship Interview will follow each contestant’s pattern. Contestant will dismount and approach the judges to answer questions specific to that horse and rider team.

Sponsor Laps/ Winner’s Lap will be ridden individually. Each royalty contestant will carry a sponsor flag while following a rodeo contestant. The goal is for the royalty contestant to stay with the rodeo contestant at varied gaits.

Cattle work will include one current queen working with one contestant. Contestant must move cattle from the chute, across the arena and into the stripping pen. Contestant will do the majority of the work but needs to know when and how to ask the queen to help out, to ensure that the rodeo keeps moving along. Junior Teen Contestants move one steer, Senior Teen Contestants and Queen Contestants move two steers.

Arena Etiquette contestants will be monitored in and outside of the arena as to their interaction with the arena crew, other contestants and other riders. Activities will be reported back for the judges, both positive and negative. Please and thank you go a long way.

Other considerations in Horsemanship include, but are not limited to:

The contestant ability and knowledge will be judged, NOT the quality of horse or equipment, however the condition and safety of equipment, and suitability of the horse will be taken into account

Each contestant will be required to provide her own horse and tack.

No chaps or stampede strings will be allowed.

Other arena work will be at the discretion of the judges and LDD Rodeo Royalty Committee.

On stage Activities

Rodeo Queens must often visit other rodeos, pageants, and parades where they are expected to speak in public, often these situations are a surprise and the queens must improvise.

* All contestants must keep their number on at all times.

Skills needed.

The ability to communicate with an audience using appropriate and correct language and good grammar. Including ability to present a speech that is well-developed, interesting and understandable.

Self-Projection on stage, including delivery, voice, personality, and manner and use of microphone.

Speeches are to be memorized. While these are speeches not skits minimal props can be used but not required.

Personal Introduction will consist of all contestants lining up on stage and one by one introducing themselves. These are short introductions including the contestant's name and maybe what title they are running for or the name of their home town.

Speech will give each contestant an opportunity to promote their “platform”, something they feel strongly about and wish to use their title to promote. The issues do not have to be huge, just important to the contestant and include a realistic way that the title can help the issue. They will include how and in what ways they will promote their issue with their title and how it relates to the sport of rodeo. Originality will be rewarded; samples will be given in the second packet. Two minutes will be expected from Junior Teen Queen Contestants and three minutes from Senior Teen and Queen Contestants.

Onstage Interview/ Impromptu Questions will be set up like an interview between the current queen and each contestant. This will not be a test of the contestant’s knowledge of facts but more about showing the contestants personality through her views and opinions on questions often addressed to rodeo queens. Samples to be included in second packet, each contestant will answer at least two questions and all contestants in each age group will answer the same amount of questions.

Queen Only, Audience Q&A “Town Hall Meeting Style” Queen contestants will be subjected to Q&A from the audience. Audience members will choose their own questions and those questions can pertain to anything the questioner feels it is important for queen contestants to know or about rodeo queens or about the contestants themselves.

Secondary Judging Categories

Appearance

This is not judged on beauty appearance, but on the overall appearance of the contestant. This category is judged in private interview, horsemanship, and the speech and modeling portions of the pageant.

This section is judged throughout the day and then taken from each section and then totaled. Appearance scores do count towards the overall winner.

Grooming: includes meticulous personal care through neatness and cleanliness in every detail, such as complexion, hands, fingernails (acrylic not required), hair, hat, boots, other apparel, horse, and tack.

Posture: including carrying themselves straight and tall with self-confidence, both on the ground and in the saddle.

Poise and ladylike behavior in every situation: This should include handling each situation with grace, style, proper etiquette and first and foremost a kind and courteous nature.

Western Fashion Sense: including western outfits that are fashionable, and tastefulness. Attention will be given to a contestant’s ability to use of style to enhance their personal features and knowledge of current queen and rodeo trends. Additional information is in the Wardrobe Guidelines in these rules.

Proper fit of clothing: including figure-flattering styles altered for a personal fit and

properly fitted and shaped hats.

Photogenic Award

This is the picture you submit at the contestant orientation. This does count towards the final scores for the pageant. Any PHOTOGRAPHS taken of contestants before or during the pageant will become property of the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Committee and will be included in a news paper article regarding the pageant.

~Each contestant must supply the Lost Dutchman Days Rodeo Royalty Pageant with one 5"x7" color photo. Photos must be head and shoulder pose (**no action shots**) in western attire. Western attire include: western blouse, suit or dress, hat and accessories. It is the responsibility of the contestant to arrange their photo session and to submit plainly **framed** photos to orientation. Photos will be for publicity purposes and the most photogenic award. If a contestant does not submit a framed photo by the deadline they will not be able to participate in this portion of the pageant.

~ Photogenic Quality including strength of character, personality and wholesomeness, photographic quality is not judged, home photos are fine.

Congeniality Award

This will only count toward the pageant outcome in the event of a tie. Votes will be tallied and the girl with more votes between the two tied contestants will win the tied category. The winner of the tie may not necessarily be the winner of Ms. Congeniality. We are doing this because our goal is to reward girls who are kind and easy to get along with. This category will be judged by the official judges, contestants and Royalty Coordinators and other LDD officials, such as past queens and LDD Committee members. Contestants will **not** vote for themselves.

1. Showing support to the other contestants.
2. Helping fellow contestants and others throughout the day of the pageant.
3. Showing true wholesomeness and friendliness to fellow contestants, spectators, parents and officials

WARDROBE GUIDELINES

Each contestant must have one complete private interview western pant and shirt outfit that can include a coat/vest or be a dress/skirt outfit, boots, belt/buckle, and hat as well. You are able to wear your horsemanship outfit for the interview as well.

Tip: Treat this portion of the pageant as a job interview. Appearance is just as important in this portion as the right answers! It is not expensive clothing the judges will be looking for but the pressed clothing, clean boots, shaped hat, clean nails, even makeup, etc..

. Each contestant must have one complete horsemanship outfit. This will include a long sleeve shirt and pants/jeans of the contestant's choice. Outfit can be simple or like those in a western pleasure horse show, and keep up with current industry trends, but the cost of the outfit is not as important as the fit and safety/repair of each item. Boots, belt/buckle and hat are also a must. Make sure your tack is clean and in good repair, an inspection will be done before entering the arena.

Tip: This portion is much like a job interview as well. It is not only the ability of you as a rider but also the ability to conduct yourself as a lady while showing off your great riding skills! Don't forget to make sure those boots are clean; your hat is ON and will NOT come off at all! This secret is Hair pins Hair pin Hair pins...oh and some Duck Tape! And your shirt stays tucked in! Monochromatic are always in fashion.

Each contestant must have a dressy outfit for onstage activities. This can be a dress or a skirt/blouse combination or a dressy pant suit. Leather is not required but a good fit including a hem that will not get caught on boots while climbing on stage is a must.

Tip: check out the Miss Rodeo America and Miss Rodeo Arizona websites to see what is in style and get outfit ideas.

NO chaps, crowns or banners, straw hats, or stampede strings are to be worn by contestants during the whole duration of the pageant.

Silent Auction items

Each contestant is required to bring 3 (unwrapped) silent auction items worth \$10 or more. Items can be homemade. Proceeds go to cover pageant costs

Horse Use Agreement
